NARR/REF A IS SECNAV MEMO DESIGNATING FUNCTIONAL AREA MANAGERS. REF B IS SECNAV INSTRUCTION 5000.36 OF 1 NOV 01 WHICH PROVIDES GUIDANCE ON THE DEPARTMENT OF NAVY DATA MANAGEMENT AND INTEROPERABILITY. REF C IS NAVY CIO MESSAGE 001-02 MODIFYING AND MANDATING PROCESSES CONTAINED IN NMCI LEGACY APPLICATION TRANSITION GUIDE AND MANDATING ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR LEGACY APPLICATION RATIONALIZATION.// RMKS/1. THIS MESSAGE ANNOUNCES IMPLEMENTATION OF AN ENTERPRISE APPROACH TO MANAGING NAVY'S INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT) APPLICATIONS AND DATABASES. OUR GOAL IS A COLLECTIVE 95 PERCENT REDUCTION IN NAVY LEGACY APPLICATIONS WITHIN ONE YEAR. THIS APPROACH IS ESSENTIAL TO SUCCESSFUL NAVY CUTOVER TO NMCI, AND WILL SPECIFY STANDARDIZED APPLICATIONS, DATABASES, AND DATA ELEMENTS FOR ALL NAVY NETWORKS (NMCI, IT21, OCONUS BLII, ETC) IN THE FUNCTIONAL AREAS IDENTIFIED IN REF A.

2. FUNCTIONAL AREA MANAGERS (FAMS) WILL HAVE AUTHORITY WITHIN THEIR FUNCTIONAL AREA AND ACROSS ECHELON II ORGANIZATIONAL LINES TO: DIRECT MIGRATION, CONSOLIDATION, OR RETIREMENT OF APPLICATIONS AND DATABASES; DEVELOP AND MANAGE IT APPLICATIONS AND DATABASE PORTFOLIOS; AND ENSURE TECHNOLOGY STRATEGIES ARE ALIGNED WITH BUSINESS/ADMINISTRATION PROCESSES AND WARFIGHTING STRATEGIES. FUNCTIONAL DATA MANAGERS, DESIGNATED IN REF B, ARE RESPONSIBLE TO THEIR RESPECTIVE FAMS. PER REF A, THE FOLLOWING ORGANIZATIONS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR DESIGNATING FAMS:

CONSISTENT WITH ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING, FAMS AND ECHELON II COMMANDS SHOULD WORK TOGETHER TO ACHIEVE ADDITIONAL EFFICIENCIES BY IDENTIFYING APPLICATIONS TO BE CONSOLIDATED/ELIMINATED AND BY ENFORCING COMPLIANCE WITH TASK FORCE WEB STANDARDS. FAMS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ACHIEVING A 95 PERCENT REDUCTION IN LEGACY APPLICATIONS WITHIN ONE YEAR. FAMS WILL REPORT PROGRESS TO NAVY INFORMATION OFFICER (N60B) QUARTERLY BEGINNING 1 JULY.

4. REPRESENTATIVES DESIGNATED BY FAMS AND ECHELON II COMMANDERS WILL PARTICIPATE IN AN OFF-SITE SCHEDULED FOR 4-5 JUNE TO FINALIZE NAVY-WIDE PROCESSES FOR SELECTING CORE APPLICATIONS AND DATABASES WITHIN A FUNCTIONAL AREA, DEVELOPING ROLE-BASED USER PROFILES, AND REDUCING APPLICATIONS AND DATABASES ACROSS THE NAVY ENTERPRISE. DETAILS WILL BE PROVIDED SEPCOR. REQUEST ECHELON II COMMANDERS IDENTIFY A POC IN EACH APPLICABLE FUNCTIONAL AREA TO DIRECTOR NAVY STAFF WITHIN 10 WORKING DAYS OF THIS MESSAGE.
